AMERICAN SYSTEM OF JUDGING

1. SEE INDIVIDUAL DEPARTMENTS FOR IMPORTANT DATES AND TIMES.
2. REFER TO LOCAL AND STATE RULES THAT APPLY TO THESE DIVISIONS.
3. Senior Divisions are open to those people 18 years old and older on the first day of the Fair.
4. Senior Local Divisions are open to legal residents or producers of El Dorado, Nevada and Placer Counties unless otherwise stated.
5. Senior Extended Divisions are open to California residents unless otherwise stated.
6. Use one still exhibit form per exhibitor. All divisions should be on the same form(s). Additional forms may be used as necessary.
7. Substitutions can only be made within the same division. Substitutions must be made when the exhibit arrives at the Fairgrounds.
8. Building Supervisors have the right to refuse to accept entries that are obviously violating the rules and requirements stated in the Exhibitor Handbook pertaining to their department.
9. All entries in the following divisions must have been made, collected, grown or prepared and entered by exhibitors within one year of the opening date of the Fair, except as otherwise noted.
10. The Gold Country Fair will use every precaution in their

power for the safe preservation of all articles and stock on exhibit, but will not be accountable for loss or damage.

11. Placement of ribbons does not guarantee correct placing in judging. Only the official placing on the judging sheet constitutes the final placement.
12. Fair Management reserves the right to divide or combine classes as warranted by the number of entries.
13. Any item not picked up on the Monday following the Fair between 2:00 and 7:00 p.m. will be disposed of by the Fair.

3. All booths shall be 10 feet by 10 feet. Side and back panels of booths are 4 feet high.
4. Extension cords must be provided by exhibitor. Cords must be heavy-duty 3-wire (grounded) type. Maximum 20 feet in length.
5. All materials & decorations used in booths must be made from non-flammable material, or treated with a flame retardant, and are subject to inspection by the Fire Marshal.
6. Exhibitors must make arrangements with the Building Supervisor to replace fruits, vegetables, etc., which deteriorate during the Fair.
7. Limit - Six entries, on a first-come, first-served basis.
