Gold Country Fair - Junior Livestock Auction

Patrick Coughran was a respected and ardent supporter of youth in agriculture. Pat believed in working hard, being involved in the community, and helping young people develop a passion for agriculture. This scholarship was founded in honor of his memory and is supported by the Junior Livestock Auction committee through proceeds earned from the sale of a donated market animal at the Junior Livestock Auction.

Please read the following scholarship criteria before submitting your application:

- 1) This scholarship applies only to applicants who have exhibited livestock or agriculture mechanics projects for TWO YEARS specifically at the Gold Country Fair.
- 2) Applicant must be enrolled in a local agricultural youth organization for at least 2 years (ie, Placer County 4-H, The National FFA Organization or National Grange).
- 3) Applicant must be a recent high school graduate within the year of application or 1 year prior to the year of application.
- 4) Applicant must provide an official educational transcript that must accompany a hard copy of the complete application, no email copies accepted!!
- 5) Applicant must submit 2 letters of recommendation (one from a leader and another from an adult that is not a related family member of applicant) which must accompany the hard copy of the complete applications, no emails accepted!!
- 6) If requested, a pplicant must be able provide a hard copy of the records they keep on their livestock projects, either the relevant pages from the 4-H and/or FFA record book that covers expenses, income and a journal of the time and chores they complete. Printed copies from an electronic record keeping program area acceptable.
- 7) The scholarship may be awarded once to any recipient, but may be awarded to more than 1 person each year.
- 8) **To qualify for an interview, all scholarship applications and required paperwork must be pre-printed hard copies turned in to the Gold Country Fair Livestock office no later than closing time on TUESDAY APRIL 2, 2019!!!**
