### **Pooled Money Investment Account Monthly Portfolio Composition** (1) 08/31/22 \$229.3 billion

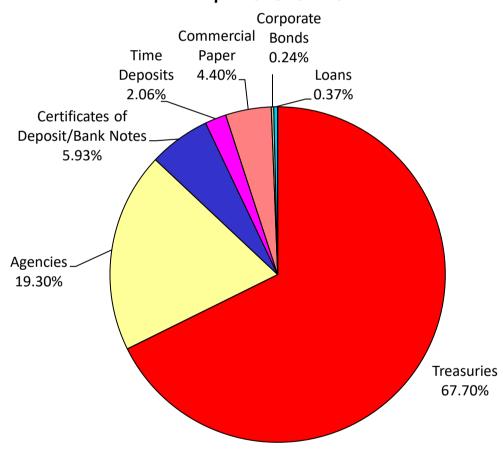

### Hello DAA CEOs

As you know, state employees who work on-site are required to provide verification of vaccination or participate in COVID-19 testing each week.

The California Department of Public Health (CDPH) has <u>amended COVID-19 policies</u> that required weekly testing for unvaccinated or decline-to-state individuals. As a result of these changes, the last day for state employee COVID-19 testing is this Friday, September 16.

What this means for you:

- -Unvaccinated/decline to state/not fully vaccinated individuals are no longer required to test weekly
- -Weekly Eligible Participant Tracking spreadsheets are no longer required
- -Positive Case Reporting is no longer required

The Health and Safety Office will be receiving additional communications in the coming days from the TTF and Color Health teams, detailing how to return testing resources if necessary, and will share additional information as it becomes available.
