 - 1. California Emergency Response Resilience Venues and Fairgrounds
 - a. CEO Ales provides an informational handout regarding C.E.R.R.V.F. CEO Ales adds that the 501c6 organization officially has a running website that includes the fairgrounds that are participating and defines their collective mission.
 - a. Director Crowley asks if the organization is fully staffed.
 - b. CEO Ales replies that the entire organization is volunteer based with the exception of the hired lobbyist group.

- a. Director Crowley asks where the organization sources funding.
- c. CEO Ales replies that as of current, funding is sourced by fairgrounds membership.
 - a. Director Houston asks how as a state entity, can the organization undermine state legislation.
- d. CEO Ales replies that the organization is a non-profit which will lobby on behalf of state entities like the District Agricultural Associations. CEO Ales states that he will confirm that detail.
- 2. Proposition 4
 - a. CEO Ales that CA Proposition 4 passed and has potential to provide some funding to fairgrounds for resiliency purposes.
 - a. Director Houston emphasizes that when and how the money is appropriated, will be up to this administration. Director Houston adds that there may be a four year window to appropriate the funds. Director Houston states that the funds will aid in extreme heat.

Pooled Money Investment Account Monthly Portfolio Composition ⁽¹⁾ 12/31/24 \$155.4 billion

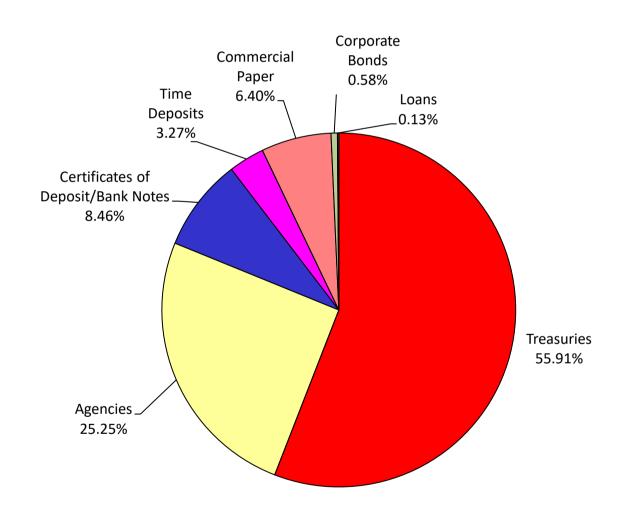

Exhibitions at Fairs and Shows

This letter is to inform you that the California Department of Food and Agriculture (CDFA) State Veterinarian Dr. Annette Jones has implemented a ban on all California Poultry and Dairy Exhibitions at Fairs and Shows, effective immediately until further notice. This action is required to minimize the danger of exposing people and non-infected birds and cows to the H5N1 Avian Influenza (Bird Flu).

The H5N1 Bird Flu is a highly contagious and often fatal disease in birds and has become widespread among dairy cows and domestic poultry (commercial and backyard flocks) in California. Since August 2024, there have been over 700 dairy herds and 60 poultry flocks affecting over 15 million birds with new dairies and flocks being detected.

Please read the enclosed letter from Dr. Annette Jones for more information on H5N1 and the ban. You can also visit the <u>CDFA HPAI H5N1 in Poultry webpage</u>. We respectfully request a 20% discount on the rental rate of \$975 for the use of the Placer Building for the Veterans Day ceremony to be held on November 11, 2025, with setup the day before.

The American Legion Post 84 in Auburn has been in existence since 1919 and we have had a Veterans Day parade in Auburn since that time. For many years we have also provided a free community lunch and ceremony following the parade to honor our veterans and to educate our community about their service and sacrifice.

The American Legion Post 84 Veterans Day Planning Committee does fund raising and solicits donations to provide free pizza and drinks for 750 - 1,000 people, commemorative medals for 500 veterans, small flags and programs to hand out to attendees of the parade and ceremony, and to pay for other expenses for the events.

For many years we were able to use the Armory building at no cost. We have also been able to reduce the cost in the past by volunteering to assist in various tasks at the fairgrounds. Unfortunately, the majority of our committee members are in their 70s or 80s, which makes volunteering for some activities very difficult. We recognize that costs for everything are going up, but until several years ago, we did not have to pay anything to rent the Armory for this community event. Two years ago, we used the Sierra Building, but it was too small for our event. Last year we used the Placer Building, which meant also renting portable staging for an additional \$250, and although it put a strain on our finances, it was a much better location for our event.
